Message from The Principal

Welcome back to term 3. It has been a positive week and the children have enjoyed sharing their adventures from the holiday period.

The Kids West holiday programme was very well used and offered a varied programme for our students. Kids West seems to be becoming a popular option for children both at Elmgrove and throughout the city. It is great that Irene and her team are so dedicated to providing this excellent programme for our students.

This term Stars on Stage, Polyfest and the Ukulele Jam are all scheduled so performance practices will be a feature of the term. We also have the O'mathalon, senior netball tournament and the Taieri 6 aside inter school to look forward to. These opportunities to participate in the arts and sports compliment the academic programmes set for the term.

As I reported last term we have now had official sign off from the Secretary of Education on the commencement of the Elmgrove School enrolment scheme. This will come into effect on day one of Term 4 2018, 14th October. We will be advertising our zone in the next few weeks and putting a detailed map up on our website. The implementation of our zone will not effect any of the families who already have children enrolled with us and we will have space to accept all of the children who have already expressed their intention to bring their children to Elmgrove this year and returned enrolment papers. Last term we received a grant from the Bendigo Trust to purchase a large tunnel house, raised gardens and a watering system. This is going to be a great asset for our enviro programme and give us the opportunity to extend our gardening and prorogation programmes with the students. I am keen to hear from some handy parents who might be interested in working to help construct this tunnel house and garden area over one weekend in the near future. Please let the office know if you are interested in helping and we will find a date that suits enough people.

Progress is also being made on the scooter track development. I have met with a designer from bikes in schools and had discussions with he DCC about our tracks. We have some more meeting set with contractors in the next few weeks to advice and quote on this project.

I am looking forward to the term ahead and I hope all of your children are too.

GENIUS This term in the Matai Hub we have introduced 'GENIUS HOUR' into our room. Genius hour is a movement that allows students to explore their own passions and encourages creativity in the classroom. It provides students a choice in what they learn during a set period of time

We have really enjoyed using different tools to write on during writing time rather than just in our writing books! This week we looked at writing newspapers about our holiday news or a topic we are assassinate about.






White boards have been another fun tool to use at writing time. We can use them to draw pictures, plan our writing, help with spieling or write down our ideas!

Jaxon used his whiteboard to help him spell tricky words.






Here Issac used them to write down adjectives and none he wanted to use in his writing







