If I was Prime Minister ...

If I was the Prime Minister one of the first things I would do is make and develop football academies across the country. The football academy will help kids not be on technology all the time and all the fresh air will help their lungs and it is always good to be doing physical activities most days. This project would not be finished in a day, not even finished in months. It will take a few years to make this a finished project with it being across the country. Fundraisers will be a big part of making this happen and also volunteers who know about the sport football, to help out on the kids paths to becoming a professional football player.
