Message from The Principal

Today was pink shirt day and we had a large number of children wearing either pink clothing or pink accessories. A big focus of this day is around how we treat each other and speaking up when you see behaviours that are not ok. Our students know and understand why this is important. Pink Shirt Day is a good opportunity to talk about this again and discuss strategies they might use if faced with bullying situations. This work will lead well into the visit from the I am Hope foundation in a couple of weeks time. This will have a focus on feelings and mental health and is part of the school focus on well-being for both staff and students.

This week our classes have had the last of their sessions with Constable Emily Ware as part of our keeping ourselves safe programmes which fits well with the Pink shirt event. This week we also had the last of our Rugby Sessions for the seniors and they also went to the Otago Museum where they got to explore the planetarium, the butterfly enclosure and the wider museum as part of their studies.

The fundraising group have organised a Bingo night for the 9th June and while I understand that they have had a good response in the number of people coming along to the evening, they are very keen to get some further donations of prizes for the night. There will be a number of raffles available to make this profitable for the school they need donations of prizes. Please have a think about what you might be able to contribute.

Teachers continue to wait for an acceptable offer from the Ministry of Education. They are currently voting on further industrial action including possible strike action. I will update you as soon as I have any news on this. Our teachers are very hard working and invested in the education of your children and I believe they deserve a better deal. None of our teachers should be earning below the living wage, but many of them are. After three years of study and the completion of their degrees they deserve better. While the offer of new classrooms and additional support for schools who have been affected by flooding is a good thing. The Government need to address the basic pay and conditions for our teachers and work towards real parity with their secondary colleagues.




Rimu Hub has been learning all about shapes in mathematics. We have had lots of fun designing shape monsters. Some of our favourite shapes are triangles and squares.


