Message from The Principal

On Tuesday night we had our Board of Trustees meeting for this month. The Board spent considerable time looking at the draft biennial staff survey. This is completed every two years to give the Board a better understanding of work load and staff satisfaction and wellbeing. We believe that this is particularly important at this time with the ongoing struggle to get recognition of our teachers value from the government through contract negotiations.

They also went over this years PAT mathematics results. This standardised assessment provides excellent information for teachers on student learning progress and gaps in understanding that they can then use to inform their teaching programmes. It is completed by Year 3 - 6 students. The results show another lift in student achievement in mathematics and student progress above expectation in all year groups when compared with he NZCER norms. At a time when Mathematics achievement has been receiving much negative publicity it is great to see that our programmes are preforming strongly in meeting the needs of our students.

Our property projects continue to progress with our contractors working in the junior bathrooms currently. They will move onto the roof alterations next and then onto the bathroom upgrades in the senior school. Our new heat pumps have been installed and the fundraising committee have contributed to upgrades and new equipment for the school playgrounds.

The fundraising group have organised a Bingo night for the 9th of June and I understand they have had a good response to this. It should be a fun night and something different so check out the notice in this newsletter for more details and book in your group. A fun night out and and an opportunity to raise funds for stage 2 of our playground improvements is a win-win for everyone, so get involved.

I would like to make a special mention of Joshua Rudd who was on the front page of the Otago Daily Times this week for the work he did to get more inclusive play equipment installed for his friend Scarlette at Hudson Park. It is always good to hear of students working to make a difference for others and this clearly demonstrates our school values.

Today in assembly I will be handing out some awards to some of our high achievers. We have Otago Swimming championship ribbons as well as some science badges that have been awarded. We also have a number of Tumeke badges being awarded.

This week our senior students have again had some coaching from the Rugby League Association. Next week they have a trip planned to the museum and planetarium as part of their latest studies.

On Fridays our Senior students will be assisting us in answering phone calls and being in charge of the office during the morning tea and lunch breaks. This presents a valuable opportunity for our seniors to gain experience, and they are excited to assist Nicola in the office. If you call during these times, we kindly ask for your patience as they are still learning.

I have seen lots of crafts this week especially in the juniors aimed at Mothers Day this weekend. I hope that it is a special day for all of our mothers and thank you for the very important work you do for yours and others children.






Matai looked at using one colour to colour in a poppy using different pencil pressure to achieve light and dark shades.
