
Mark your calendars: School Disco – Friday, September 12. This is always a highlight for the kids. Entry is a gold coin, and there will be treats for sale in the hall.

TOUCH


Touch is played in Terms 1 and 4, and is available for children in years 0-6. Games are played on a Monday afternoon at Peter Johnstone Park.

Enrolment at Elmgrove School is governed by an enrolment scheme. The details of the school's scheme are available from the school office and on the school website.

If you live in the home zone of Elmgrove School, your child has automatic right of entry. If you plan to enrol your child at Elmgrove School during 2026 but have not yet signalled this to the school, please contact the school office as soon as possible.

If you live outside of the school's home zone, you <u>do not</u> have automatic right of enrolment. Please read the following carefully.

OUT-OF-ZONE PLACES FOR 2026

The Board of Trustees has determined that there are spaces available for out-of-zone enrolments of new entrant students in 2026

There will also be a limited number of spaces available for out-of-zone enrolments of students in other areas of the school.

Applications for enrolment of **Out-of-Zone** students for 2026 close at 1 pm on Friday, 12th September 2025. Please email the school (**office@elmgrove.school.nz**) to register your child.

If **Out-of-Zone** applications exceed the number of places available, a ballot will be held, which is governed by the Education Act and will be processed according to the order of priority.
